#### 8-24-19 Fall Meeting Minutes

Officers In Attendance: Diann Scott, Ned Lichtsinn, Anne Bougher, Steve McNary, Rosie Risser, Paul Veldman, Denny Andrews, Tom Goyings

Diann started meeting introducing and welcoming 5 new members to the association. Ben Castle and Dana Abbott were special guest speakers.

Secretary's Report – minutes of the June 8<sup>th</sup>, 2019 Spring was approved as read.

<u>Treasurer Report</u> – approved as presented.

#### **Old Business**

- 121 homes had water in them in 2019, 22 homes with water in 2018 and 11 this year.
- Ben Castle County Assessor. 137 reported water damage in 2017. To get credit on your county taxes and assessment, keep track of clean-up hours and keep track of expenses to repair property damage, this will be needed to fill out the proper paperwork. You should provide receipts, pictures and estimates.

#### Presidents report

- Vegetation DNR grant for fall treatment (we pay 20%). Treated 13 acres in June. Cleaned out 25 acres.
- Sediment 9 sites evaluated 134 square miles drain into us. Two were selected as DNR Sediment grant recipients in 2019, Gonser and Boughy Ditch (sand bar). These costs are in our budget and work will be preformed in Fall 2020. LARE Grant pays 80%, County has agreed to pay 10%, and we will pay the remaining 10%. We plan to apply to do Gretzsinger ditch (\$20,000) next year and the transition area Cosperville 9000 feet forward.
- Water management Mike Schaefer. Collects water data, estimates sediment, looking for photos to see how water comes off property. Pays attention to ditches. Mike explained USGS graphs. Also discussed our efforts in working to change current Drainage Laws which have been in place since 1964. Tamarack is filling with sediment.
- <u>Paul Veldman</u> Conservancy District gives us a tax organization to obtain money. Trying to get a 3<sup>rd</sup> bid. River Clean up 200 trees removed to date. All hours in clean up used toward in kind money for our portion of grants.
- Other support. Lake management, county commissioners, etc. 5 Lakes conservation gave us a \$1,000 donation for weed clean up. Sundaes on Sylvan donated 2 tubs of ice cream for association dinner.

#### **New Business**

- Only 34% membership paid for year.
- Need fundraising chairman. Working on new budget for 2020. Donations are tax deductible.
- <u>Election of officers</u>: VP Ned Lichtsinn, Treasurer Rosie Risser, Lake Directors Tom Goyings (Waldron), Ann Bougher (Steinbarger).
- 50/50 drawing was donated back. \$155
- Report law breakers on lakes to DNR

## Bylaw Changes – Randy Mull

The Board approved the following three changes to the West Lakes Association Bylaws:

### Bylaw Changes – continued

Amended Section 2 Under Article III – Board of Directors and Officers

## <u>Section 2. NUMBER, TENURE, AND QUALIFICATIONS: \* Amended 7-28-91, 8-16-97, 07-18-20</u>

a. Officers shall consist of the President, Vice President, Secretary, Treasurer and Immediate Past President. Officers will be elected at the regular August meeting. Officers will be elected for a two (2) year *term with a maximum of* two (2) Officers being elected each year. Beginning in August 1997, the Officers will be elected on the following rotation: 1997-President and Secretary shall be elected to a one (1) year term and thereafter be elected to a two (2) year term on even years. Vice-President and Treasurer shall be elected to a two (2) year term on *odd years*. Each Officer shall hold office until her/his successor shall have been elected and qualified, except when an Officer is unable to complete her/his term, a successor will be elected to complete the original term. *In the event the President is not re-elected,* they shall assume the roll of Immediate Past President with full voting rights as the other officers for a period not to exceed 2 years.

## Bylaw Changes – continued

Added Section 5 Under Article IV Officers

#### Section 5. Immediate Past President: \*Amended 07-18-20

• After the election of a new President, the Immediate Past President will serve in an advisory position to the new President with full voting rights. The Immediate Past President will provide continuity and assist with the smooth transition to the new president. In addition, the Immediate Past President will serve as an ambassador to outside organizations at the request of the president, assist the president with committees as requested, mentor new board members, provide historical background information and other information and other duties as requested.
